



Jean Paul Bradshaw and Kurt Schaefer to Speak at Swine Institute

(October 24, 2011) – Lathrop Gage partners Jean Paul Bradshaw (Tort – Kansas City) and Kurt Schaefer (Environmental – Jefferson City) are speaking at the University of Missouri Extension Commercial Agriculture Program’s 2011 Swine Institute: Missouri Industry Outlook.
