Additionally, Jewett-Brewster was one of only 14 attorneys in the United States, Canada and Mexico to be selected for and inducted into the ACCFL's 2023 class of fellows. The ACCFL is a professional organization dedicated to improving and enhancing the practice of commercial finance law and the ethics of the profession. The ACCFL's mission is to bring together into an association those highly qualified members of the legal profession who, by reason of their character, skill, and ability, will contribute to its goals, accomplishments, and good fellowship. Fellows are practicing lawyers, jurists and academics licensed to practice law who have maintained excellent character, achieved preeminence in the field, and made substantial and sustained contributions to the promotion of learning and scholarship in commercial finance law through teaching, lecturing, published writings or continuing legal education.
