Key Takeaways:

1. In-house personnel must memorialize all steps they take to gather and produce subpoenaed documents in the event issues or disputes arise later over the production.
2. Key constituents such as the CEO, Board of Directors, and General Counsel should immediately be made aware of any non-routine government subpoenas.
3. It's critical to work with the government to narrow the time frame and/or scope of the subpoena as appropriate, and to memorialize any agreements that you enter into with the government concerning the production.
